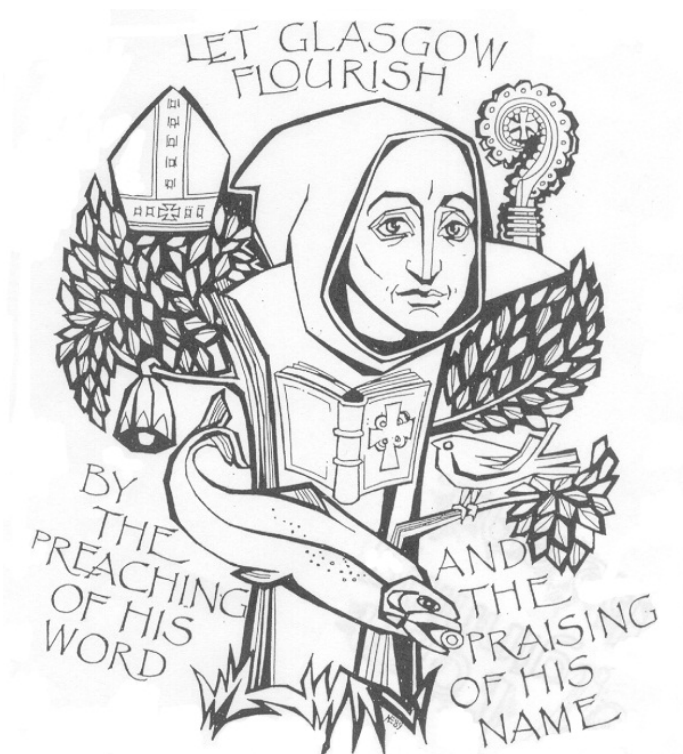


Morning Prayer for St Mungo's Day 2012
